
We are called in community.

Meanwhile, national news media including The New York Times exposed this hometown conflict to an American audience divided by Cold War politics. Join Susan Johns, co-creator of the GCC Archives and President of the Glenview History Center, for a presentation based on primary sources and archival artifacts telling a fascinating but little known tale of local history.
