NEW SEASON

Nearly all churches begin their program year in early September. Labor Day weekend marks the unofficial end of summer and the beginning of the academic year in schools and colleges. In Protestant churches, the first Sunday after Labor Day is given many names. In the churches I have served, it has been called Homecoming Sunday and Recovenanting Sunday. At GCC, it is called Rally Sunday. The idea of course is that many were away from work, church, and school during the summer and now it is time to start a "new year". And there are several "new years" besides January 1. The Jewish New Year (Rosh Hashannah) begins on sundown on September 15. Originally, the Christian liturgical calendar began its "new year" on September 1 in part because this was the beginning of fiscal or taxation year in the Roman Empire. Later, after the Western Latin Church split from the Eastern Byzantine Church in 1054, the Western Church moved the start of the church year to the First Sunday of Advent (this year it is December 3). So, Catholics and Protestants deem Advent to be the start of a new church year. But the Eastern Orthodox Churches retain the older date - their church year still begins September 1.

At GCC, our program year begins with Rally Sunday and there will be many new things. Foremost, we will welcome Abigail Lutz as our inaugural Pastoral Resident. She will be a full-time member of the staff and will be involved in all aspects of GCC's ministry. Julie Evans, our new youth ministry director, will be relaunching the Middle School and High School youth groups with weekly meetings on Sunday late afternoon and Wednesday evening. Our Confirmation classes will begin at 9:00 AM on Sundays before worship which will allow confirmands to easily attend worship at 10:00 AM. Chris Calandra will continue to ably manage our church school. There will be new adult education programming, enhanced pastoral care, and more robust outreach opportunities. GCC will engage with its interfaith and ecumenical partners in a much stronger way, recovering a tradition for which we have long been known. Gary Wendt

and Guillermo Muñoz-Küster will be exploring a variety of musical offerings. We will also be looking at alternative forms of contemporary worship.

This will be the first truly post-Covid year at GCC and there remains much work to do yet many opportunities. All churches are in a process of reinventing themselves due to the hangover effects of a year of closures in 2020-2021. It is worth noting that the World Health Organization did not end its Covid-19 international public health emergency declaration until May 3, 2023. In the United States, the Biden Administration ended its own emergency declaration on May 11, 2023 – only four months ago.

Our 2024 Generosity Campaign, graciously chaired by Maren Miller, has adopted the slogan "Behold, I am making all things new" (Rev. 21:5). I invite you all to embrace and participate in this new season at GCC.

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL CALL TO MEETING, SEPTEMBER 24, 2023

The Glenview Community Church Special Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, September 24, 2023, at 11:15am, in the church sanctuary.

Two items will be discussed and voted on at this meeting:

- 1) Motion and congregational vote to approve the creation of an outdoor memorial garden according to the plans presented with the following provisions:
 - a. The cost will not exceed \$114,000.
 - b. The initial construction costs would be paid for, in large part, by a loan from the unrestricted capital reserve and will be repaid.
 - c. Each individual cremains grave plot cost will be set at \$2000 and the fee will be reviewed annually.
- 2) In order for Abigail Lutz to meet the Committee on Ministry's requirements for her ordination, a motion and congregational vote to approve the Glenview Community Church Letter of Call confirming Ms. Abigail Lutz as Pastoral Resident from September 2023 to September 2025.

This notice constitutes the official call to meeting. In accordance with the congregation's constitution, no other business shall be transacted. 50 members need to be present to establish a quorum. Please plan to attend.
