I think part of the role of a pastor is being a "meaning maker". In crafting rituals, planning worship, hearing people's stories, we are helping people make meaning. It is hard sometimes to make meaning. We might not want to make meaning of things that are painful, or we might feel apathetic and declare something as simply "meaningless". It is also dangerous sometimes to make meaning. We (as pastors, chaplains, ministers, etc.) should be careful not to give people our own meanings, but instead to encourage and empower them to find their own.

I have been thinking about how a new year is ripe with potential for meaning making! While in many tangible ways, nothing may change from December 31st to January 1st... We can choose to see the transition from 2023 to 2024 as a sacred new beginning. We can make meaning of the transition to a new year.

For the past few years, I have done this by writing a letter to myself. Each year, around New Year's Eve or New Year's Day, I open last year's letter, read it, reflect on it, and then set out to write a new letter (to be opened next year around the same time). The letter tends to start with retrospective reflection on what the last year has been. Although I have not written my letter yet for this year, I imagine this section will talk about how at the beginning of 2023 I was preparing for my last semester of seminary, unsure of what my next steps would be after graduation. I might follow that arc all the way to the summer where I began to prepare for a move to Glenview, and to where I am now, four months into my position as pastoral resident at GCC! I will likely then take time to relish in feelings of gratitude, recognizing and giving thanks for God's hand in opening doors and leading me to where I ended up.

The letter also includes a "looking ahead;" what my hopes are for the year to come.

I look ahead to where I want to see God work, and how I want to be a part of that work. Some might be more measurable: "I want to start doing this..." but others might be less so: "I want to feel this way..." or "I want my year to be full of... community, joy, intentionality, etc." These things are less measurable but just as meaningful. Then I put my letter in an envelope and seal it, not to be opened until the following new year. Come to think of it, that is an important part of the ritual. The letter, the reflecting, and most importantly the "hopes for the new year", are not hung on my wall to act as a "to-do" list. Instead, they get tucked in an envelope and I trust that the year will emerge exactly as God intends for it to emerge. Then next year New Year's Eve or New Year's Day, I might just open my letter and realize something I thought would be a priority ended up not being so, and there is grace, and there is curiosity, and sometimes I might laugh at my past self for my naivety and then... I start the whole ritual again.

My letter writing ritual is just one of the ways that I choose to make meaning of the new beginning that is a new year. I wonder what a new year means to you. I wonder what arc you might draw if you look back at the year past. I wonder what hopes you have for the year ahead. What is it you want to feel? How is it you want to be? Whatever meaning you find yourself making this new year, I am praying God's blessings for you, for our church, and for our community.

May you look back and reflect on where you experienced God in the year past.

May you look ahead in anticipation of seeing God's work and how you are meant to be a part of it, in the year ahead. In Gratitude and Love, Pastor Abigail

- Make your own salad dressing with olive oil, balsamic vinegar and Dijon mustard Shop the perimeter of the Grocery Store and buy sparingly in the center where the processed foods are. You'll reduce your sugar intake and give your body essential


